## Salem received \$5,400 Leonhart Grant

Our denomination is the United Church of Christ and as part of the UCC, we are part of the Illinois Conference of the UCC.

Salem is part of a smaller collection of congregations that are part of the Western Association that works in partnership with the Illinois Conference.

The Western

Association offers its congregations the opportunity to apply for a Leonhart Grant. Leonhart Grants are one-time grants, intended to be seed money for a new project or funds to enable a local church or church related organization to carry out a project that is beyond the organization's financial capacity.

Our Outreach Ministry is working to re-brand our congregation in the community as LBGTQ+ friendly and proponents of gender and racial

equality.

We are looking at using billboard sized banners, lawn signs, and other means to communicate who we are and what we stand for. We were

granted \$5,400 from the Leonhart Grant committee to do this and they thanked Salem Church for doing such great ministry in our community.

Don't forget that on June 5 an intergenerational activity is planned. Lunch will be at 11 am in Fellowship Hall.




The church will provide the chicken, tea/cool-aid/ water, place settings, balloons, and bubbles.
