#### IMPACT OF SALEM'S OUTREACH MISSIONS

Every month, Salem volunteers contribute to the community in many ways—but we don't always know the extent and impact of those contributions. We will use this newsletter to share that information for better awareness.

**BJ's Café / Saturday Meals**: In the period from Sat, 7/22, through Sat, 8/19, 407 meals were served.

Loads of Love: On two Thursdays —7/27 and 8/10 — 62 people received assistance with 168 loads of laundry.

Paws and Prayers: On August 12, this ministry provided 108 sacks & 36 cans of dog food, 97 bags & 43 cans of cat food, 18 bags of dog treats, and 30 miscellaneous items (leashes, bowls, toys, blankets, coats, shot/license vouchers).

God's Garden: Since we began harvesting, a total of 50 pounds of veggies have been donated to Horizons or given to our guests at BJ's Café.

Health Fair: On August 19, Health Fair volunteers provided 90 grateful people with items to assist with personal hygiene.

Salem is making a difference in our community. Thanks to all the volunteers and to you for your support.

Salem has three internal ministries which work with Pastor Matt to make sure the infrastructure is sound and that church members and guests are nurtured through group activities (and food). Meeting monthly on the second Wednesday, each of these ministries would benefit from additional members—and it's safe to say members benefit personally from this closer connection to the workings of the



church. Following are brief descriptions of each Ministry's mission and some of the activities they oversee.

The **Connections Ministry** is focused on making connections between Salem members through fun activities created to engage all ages. We try to do some activity every-other month and will be starting every-other month pot-lucks after the Breathe Deep service. Some activities we have hosted are "Bubbles, Balloons and Board Games; Halloween Fun; Christmas Soup, Ornaments & Crafts; a "Spring" paint night; Easter egg hunt and brunch; B'ginning of Summer BBQ; and Sips & Strikes bowling. They are now planning another Halloween event, Christmas event, and Cocoa & Carols with our Good Samaritan Family.



There are several ways that people volunteer—time, talent, and treasure. The people who make up the Salem Praise

Team donate their time and talent for the rest of us to treasure. Barb Edwards; her daughters Cassie Koch and Katie Hoffman; David Shaffer; Linsey Laughlin; Rob Ward; and Steve Hinkle have been working together since May to provide our monthly Breathe Deep worship service. Their collective goal moving forward is to keep improving the quality and substance of their performances and to have an open door for anyone that wants to express their faith through music. In preparation for the monthly service, they meet to pick songs that fit the service with a focus on having different styles in every service. They are still figuring out what works best for the band and the congregation, and suggestions are always welcome. We can all agree that the traditional hymns sung in worship are wonderful, but the exposure to the wide range of Christian music being written today makes the Breathe Deep worship service all the more special.
