IMPACT OF SALEM'S OUTREACH MISSIONS

Every month, Salem volunteers contribute to the community in many ways—but we don't always know the extent and impact of those contributions. We will use this newsletter to share that information for better awareness.

BJ's Café / Saturday Meals: In the period from Saturday, 8/26, through Saturday, 9/16, 345 meals were served.

Loads of Love: On two Thursdays — 8/24 and 9/14 — 86 people received assistance with their family's laundry, providing the means to wash 499 loads of laundry.

Paws and Prayers: On September 10, this ministry provided 175 bags & 29 cans of dog food, 137 bags & 42 cans of cat food, 18 bags of dog treats, 4 bags of cat treats, and 39 miscellaneous items (leashes, bowls, toys, blankets, coats, collars, etc.).

God's Garden: The garden is done for the year. Since we began harvesting, a total of 125 pounds of veggies have been donated to Quanada, Horizons or given to our guests at BJ's Café.

Health Fair: On September 18, Health Fair volunteers provided 100 grateful people with items to assist with personal hygiene.





Salem's "Sunday School" was renamed Re:Charge to reflect the opportunity of recharging our faith through various forms of Christian education and for all ages. Salem is lucky to have some dedicated volunteers who help guide this recharging. Norma Spory teaches 3-6 year olds. Sue Welch and Victoria Dry teach 2nd through 5th graders. Both classes use a curriculum from the Brethren Press; this semester's theme is "Becoming a People of God" using stories from Genesis and Exodus. They also have activity books and frequently do a craft that extends the lesson. Annette Newquist teaches a weekly adult Bible study that meets after coffee hour in the conference room. The topics are chosen by the participants. They just finished Isaiah Part 1 and will next start a study on the video series The Chosen.
