-week Connect Groups that are studying Jonah.

Yet, it was God who would require Jonah to go to Nineveh to give the people a second chance to turn things around. I am pretty sure when Jonah finally agrees to go to Nineveh, it's in the hopes that God would wipe out the people he hates. Well....the opposite happens when the people turn from their evil ways so thoroughly, even the animals are included in this repentance. So, God's mind is changed, and the people are spared from holy destruction.

Of course, this really irks Jonah. It's like getting to the end of a classic Clint Eastwood/Dirty Harry movie only to see the bad guys have a change of heart, turn from their evil ways, and want to reconcile with their enemies. No - that's not how we want to see that movie end! We want that bad guy in the tower, and to see Clint Eastwood's character blow the bad guy away!

IMPACT OF SALEM'S OUTREACH MISSIONS

Every month, Salem volunteers contribute to the community in many ways—but we don't always know the extent and impact of those contributions. We will use this newsletter to share that information for better awareness. The data tells the story...

BJ's Café / Saturday Meals: In the period from Saturday, 9/23, through Saturday, 10/21, **420 meals were served**.

Loads of Love: On two Thursdays — 9/28 and 10/12 — 80 people received assistance with their family's laundry, provided with the means to wash 547 loads of laundry.

Paws and Prayers: On October 14, this ministry provided 147 bags & 14 cans of dog food, 110 bags & 32 cans of cat food, 19 bags of dog treats, 3 bags of cat treats, and 57 miscellaneous items (leashes, bowls, toys, blankets, coats, collars, vouchers, etc.).

God's Garden: The garden is done for the year. Since we began harvesting, a total of 125 pounds of veggies have been donated to Quanada, Horizons or given to our guests at BJ's Café.

Health Fair: On October 21, Health Fair volunteers provided 100 grateful people with items to assist with personal hygiene.

Salem is making a difference in our community. Thanks to all the volunteers and to you for your support.
