IMPACT OF SALEM'S OUTREACH MISSIONS

Every month, Salem volunteers contribute to the community in many ways—but we don't always know the extent and impact of those contributions. We will use this newsletter to share that information for better awareness. The data tells the story...

BJ's Café / Saturday Meals: In the period from Saturday, 10/28, through Saturday, 11/18, **382 meals were served**.

Loads of Love: On two Thursdays — 10/26 and 11/9 — 87 people received assistance with their family's laundry, provided with the means to wash 616 loads of laundry.

Paws and Prayers: On November 11, this ministry provided 184 bags & 28 cans of dog food, 112 bags & 24 cans of cat food, 17 bags of dog treats, 3 bags of cat treats, and 36 miscellaneous items (leashes, bowls, toys, blankets, coats, collars, vouchers, etc.).

God's Garden: The garden is done for the year. Since we began harvesting, a total of 125 pounds of veggies has been donated to Quanada, Horizons or given to our guests at BJ's Café.

Health Fair: On November 18, Health Fair volunteers provided 115 grateful people with items to assist with personal hygiene.

Salem is making a difference in our community. Thanks to all the volunteers <u>and to you</u> for your support.
