Property Task Force meets the first Tuesday of every month at 4:30pm in the church conference room. Members of the team include: Carol Hochgraber, Resource Representative; Paul Goehl; Ric Hillebrenner; Jacob Zimmerman; Sharon Higgins, Resource Ministry Chairperson.



The task force oversees the maintenance and use of all church property (building, land and equipment, etc.). Property maintenance may be paid from funds available through endowment restricted investments or unrestricted memorials. The Property Task Force is accountable to the Resource Ministry. Here are some of the many items that they have accomplished:

- Cleaned out the youth and bridal rooms in the sanctuary basement so the space could be rented to the Montessori School.
- Help with the upkeep of the 3 garages and the space behind the curtain in fellowship hall.
- Oversee the work of outside company providing lawncare and the snow removal.
- Maintain the custodial closets, ensuring needed supplies are stocked.
- Upkeep of the grounds and the playground area on State Street.
- Installed the new fence in the courtyard area for the safety of the Montessori School students and the church's young people; this was done by Paul G. & Ric H.
- Replace lights in the building and the surrounding areas of the church property.
- Minor repairs in and around the building and the sanctuary as needed.
- Maintain the wooden fence on the playground and the material on the area under the playground equipment.
- Work with Ken Abbath as needed on some of the maintenance items around the building.
- Operate the floor scrubber and the buffer.
- Obtain and review quotes for new equipment, larger repairs, or extra cleaning jobs we have around the church.
- Help with setups for events going on in the church such as those organized by the Evening Guild.
- Supervise and recruit extra help with Sunday morning snow removal as needed; the outside contractor will do the initial cleaning.
- Ric Hillebrenner remodeled the old restroom in the basement for the Montessori School students last summer after they took over the remaining rooms in the basement. This project saved the church and school a lot of money by using our people to complete.

The Property Task Force does more than just oversee projects—we all work together to make them happen and get completed trying to save the church money. This group works very well together to the help Salem and her people.
