Even before Covid, church life had already started to change drastically from what we were used to in the decades that preceded. In 2024, we continue to adjust and make changes in order to birth and nurture faith, be inclusive, and educate people in matters of faith in ministry. Yes, our congregation

is on the smaller side of church compared to decades before, but we have been skillful at pivoting and adjusting in recent years.

One of the challenges we continue to experience is Christian education for our young people. Over the last 5 or 6 years we were able to have two classes for grade school youth. This fall we will be moving to a one class, one room model for all our grade school youth. This means pre-K through 5th grade will all be together. The reason behind this change is two-fold. One being difficulty in finding 2+ teachers for more than one classroom. The other issue is being able to plan for enough youth in each classroom on any given Sunday.

Seeing this need coming sooner rather than later, we assembled a youth Christian education team to evaluate the needs of the children and decide the best way to do a one room Christian educational experience for our youth. The input, feedback, and participation was excellent and we now have a plan in place for making this happen in the fall of this year.

I cannot stress to you how important this is for our congregation. It might surprise many of us, but children - including our own - often struggle to know important things like Christmas being about Jesus' birth (and not only about Santa) or Easter being about the resurrection of Jesus (and not only about the Easter bunny). Most will never learn about Abraham, Moses, David and Goliath, Daniel and the Lion Den, Jesus and Zacchaeus, Feeding of the 5000, the Prodigal Son, and the Good Samaritan without a class like we offer. These Biblical teachings and stories are how we nurture the faith and set young people up to have

meaningful relationships with God. We don't serve God or do ministry in a vacuum. The Biblical witness shows what we have done in the past, and it helps guide us in the present and into the future. Please pray for and encourage our young people, our teachers, and our families with children. This is essential for passing on the faith to the next generations.


